All voters of the City of Bondurant shall vote for Mayor, and two Council Members at-Large. The polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. and the polling place to be used is as follows:

Public Health & Safety

The City Council discussed a draft of a hunting ordinance at the October 2nd and 16th meetings. Based on discussions at the October 2nd meeting, the Council addressed the following on hunting within city limits.

- 1. The hunter has The hunter has a State of Iowa hunting license;
- 2. The area being hunted is zoned as "A-1 Agriculture" and no hunting occurs within 200 yards of any building inhabited or utilized by people or domestic livestock;
- 3. The hunter uses only a shotgun or .22 caliber gun or a Bow and Arrow;
- 4. The owner and tenant, if applicable, of the property have given written permission for hunting to occur on the property;
- 5. The hunters has provided a copy of the person's individual hunting license, the address or



map of where they are hunting, and a copy of the property owner/ tenant permission slip to the City Clerk for the City to keep on file.

6. The Council approves the permit.

The Council will continue discussion at the November 6 City Council meeting.

Pedestrian Crossings

You may have noticed recently new sidewalk construction at 2nd and Blaine with pictures provided below. There are many pedestrians who cross here to access the trail connection further south on Blaine. The additional sidewalk was constructed here and on Blaine to accommodate pedestrians who use this path.

The City is also working with the School District to construct a pedestrian crossing at Aaron Avenue. Ultimately, the City would like to install pedestrian lights to enhance the safety of the existing and future sidewalk crossings and is currently seeking grant funds to help offset the cost of the crossing lights. The lighting for each crossing is approximately \$10,000, meaning the City is working to secure a total of \$30,000 in funding to purchase and install pedestrian crossing lights in key areas.

While we work to further enhance the walk ability of the community, please drive safely and remember that we are fortunate to have active pedestrians and bicyclists in our community. It is important to be aware of safety for everyone in the community.

Earlier this year, the City of Bondurant as a member of the Polk County Emergency Commission, submitted the hazard mitigation strategy of restoring Mud Creek to its original channel, including as part of the project the box culvert improvements under 2nd Street. The City plans to apply for a FEMA grant and the attached resolution approves a local match for hazard mitigation program. This commitment is required in order for the city to submit for the grant.
