SNOW REMOVAL TIPS!

Snow is on the way and controlling snow and ice is a difficult and time-consuming operation. We need your help to help us to clear the streets more quickly and completely.

Crews can do a better job of plowing when cars are not parked on the street. We ask that residents park their vehicles off the street during snow removal operations. City ordinance prohibits the parking of vehicles on public streets when snow or ice removal operations are in progress. Parking on public streets will result in ticketing and towing. Fewer cars on streets will quicken plowing.

The equipment that we use to clear snow from streets may leave a ridge of snow across your driveway. It is the responsibility of the property owner to remove the ridge left by our snow plowing equipment. When shoveling out the mouth of your driveway, throw the snow to the right or left, but not in the street. Putting the snow back into the street creates more work and a safety risk.

To help ensure that sidewalks are safe during the winter, City Ordinance requires residents to remove snow and ice from sidewalks within **24 hours** following the end of the snowfall. Property owners who do not comply are subject to a municipal citation. A helpful hint – clear your sidewalk after the snowplows have finished plowing to the curb. When you remove snow from your sidewalk, please remember that City Ordinance prohibits placing that snow in the street. Additionally, the unnatural deposit of snow from driveways and parking lots onto City rights-of-way is also prohibited.

Equipment operators often work 12 or more hours in a shift and appreciate courteous and friendly drivers and pedestrians. Please remember to maintain a safe following distance of 75 feet from all snow removal equipment.

Bondurant Has a Weather Station

The Bondurant Weather Station has become a reality, thanks to the efforts of Roy McCleary, Stormwater Coordinator with the City, Lance Maffin, Science Instructor with Bondurant-Farrar High School, and the Earth Science classes. This project was made possible with grant funds from Monsanto.

Students at Bondurant-Farrar High School needed a weather station to inform them of 0.5 inch rainfall events so that the Earth Science class would be able to monitor stormwater quality. This project also benefits the whole community, as the public now has the opportunity to use this weather station.

To access the weather station, you must have internet capability. Simply visit www.weatherlink.com/user/bondurant and you will view current weather conditions at Bondurant-Farrar High School. You may also log on to www.cityofbondurant.com, where the link is available under About Bondurant, Weather Conditions. The link will also be available on the Bondurant-Farrar School's website.

A big "thank you" to the following people who helped install the weather station: Jon Hamborg, Lance Maffin, Roy McCleary, Ken Grove, and Pat Collison. A special thanks goes to Todd Stewart of Stewart Electric for donating the use of his bucket truck to install the weather station onto the High School building. Todd also installed electricity to the rain collector heater so that snow could be measured in amount of rainfall. Most people would say one inch of rain equals 10 inches of snow, but as most science students would tell you, it is determined by the amount of moisture in the snow. The rain collector heater allows for the measurement of that moisture.

Best-sellers and classic titles available anytime, anywhere BCL has expanded its WILBOR services to include eBooks available to download from the library's website. Library card holders can check out and download eBooks anytime, anywhere by visiting www.bondurant.lib.ia.us. Titles will automatically expire at the end of the 14-day lending period. And with digital downloads. . .no late fees!



Users can browse the library's website, check out with a valid library card, and download to a PC, Mac®, and many mobile devices. To read eBooks in the WILBOR collection, users will need to install Adobe® Digital Editions free software. A link to the software is available on the WILBOR web site on the Quick Start Guide page <http://wilbor.lib.overdrive.com>.

Adobe Digital Editions software is the industry standard software and installs in less than two minutes with a broadband connection. It is a simple and attractive way to read and manage DRM (Digital Rights Management)-protected EPUB and PDF eBooks. EPUB is a re-flowable eBook format and the emerging standard for digital publications. This means you can resize the text or the screen to suit you and the text will wrap itself around in the available space. Many publishers provide their best-selling titles only in EPUB, while graphic-heavy eBooks are often available in PDF.

eBooks accessed via the WILBOR Consortium can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices like the Sony® Reader™, Barnes & Noble Nook™ and iPad® coming soon. At this point, eBooks through the WILBOR Consortium are not compatible with the Kindle. For a list of compatible readers for WILBOR eBooks, visit OverDrive's website www.overdrive.com.
