BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

The City of Bondurant requires that a BUILDING PERMIT be obtained before any new construction, alteration and / or addition is started. The following are examples that require building permits:

- Addition to the principal building
- Construction of or addition to garage
- Construction of decks
- Construction of fences
- Construction and placing of storage sheds
- Construction of swimming pools and hot tubs
- Signs

The City of Bondurant contracts building inspections with the City of Altoona. Building permit applications are available at the Altoona Building Department, 1504 – 8th Street, Southwest, Altoona, Iowa. For questions call 515-967-5138.

If it is determined that you have begun construction without a building permit, you will be notified by our Building Official. Failure to comply with the requirements of the City Code of Bondurant and obtain a building permit shall be punishable by a Civil Penalty of \$750 plus court costs and legal fees. If the infraction is a repeat offense, it shall be punishable by a Civil Penalty of \$1,000 plus court costs and legal fees.



CITY PURCHASES NEW WATER & SEWER UTILITY TRUCK

The City has purchased a new truck for use by Water & Sewer Utility Superintendent Pat Collison. The new truck is a 2010 Ford F-150 and replaces a 2003 Chevrolet with over 100,000 miles. The truck was purchased from Stivers Ford for a price of \$15,257 with the trade in. The sticker price on the truck was \$30,980. Street Department Superintendent Ken Grove will receive a 2011 F-350 at the end of August. Price for that truck with the trade in will be \$19,928.



Sewer Rates Increased on July 1

The increase in sewer rates for Bondurant started with the July 1 utility bill. The flat rate, which includes the first 1,300 gallons of usage, has increased from \$7.97 per month to \$10.21. The usage rate has increased from \$8.62 per thousand gallons of water used to \$11.04. For example, for people with 5,000 gallons of water use per month, the monthly sewer charge has increased from \$39.86 to \$51.06. The primary reason for this rate increase is an increase in Wastewater Reclamation Authority (WRA) charges to the City of Bondurant. The City's WRA charges have increased 50%, or \$58,761, from \$152,106 in the 2010 fiscal year which ended June 30, to \$210,867 in the 2011 fiscal year which begins July 1. The City has been a member of the WRA since 2004. The WRA will be constructing a sewer extension to Bondurant in 2013. At that time, the City's wastewater treatment lagoons will go out of service. Smaller sewer rate increases are anticipated on July 1 of 2012, 2013 and 2014.

CITY CONSIDERING CEMETERY IMPROVEMENTS

The City expects to make several improvements to the City cemetery this year. Perimeter cyclone fencing on the north and a portion of the east side will be removed. The fence poles and fabric are in poor condition. The fence presents a barrier that makes snow removal, mowing and weed trimming more difficult. White corner posts will be installed to mark the corners of the property.

A new entryway will be constructed. The existing brick pillars and cyclone fencing at the entrance will be removed. They will be replaced with stone entry columns on both sides of the road and an iron archway connecting the stone columns. The iron work will read "Bondurant Cemetery" and possibly list the year the cemetery was established. If anyone has documentation for the year the cemetery was established, please call the City Hall at 967-2418. Several sections of white board or PVC X pattern fencing will extend out from the stone columns along the west boundary of the property.

The City hopes to complete construction this year. A rendering of the proposed entryway is shown below.

City Has Established Stormwater Utility

The City of Bondurant has established a Stormwater Utility effective July 1. The Utility has been started to assure compliance with the City's Stormwater Permit issued by the Iowa DNR. Bondurant, along with approximately 45 other cities in Iowa, was issued a Stormwater Permit by the DNR in 2005. This permit lists a number of activities the City must perform. These include inspecting construction sites to assure that erosion control measures are in place, performing regular cleaning of the City's storm sewers, conducting public education activities regarding stormwater, and other things. There are a number of capital improvements that the City should be constructing in the next 5 to 10 years to improve stormwater flow in Bondurant. These include possible drain tile replacement and installing concrete waterways in a number of overland flowage areas. The concrete waterways will improve water flow in overland flowage areas and will allow for improved maintenance in these locations.

The City Council had the final consideration of a Stormwater Utility Ordinance at its June 21 City Council meeting. This ordinance covers all properties, including tax exempt properties, in Bondurant. A stormwater charge for each property will appear on the monthly utility bill starting with the July 1 bill. Residential properties will be charged a stormwater fee of \$2.50 per month. The monthly fee for non-residential properties will be based on the amount of impervious surface which is primarily roofs, driveways and parking areas. Most other metro area communities have established stormwater utilities or are in the process of doing so. Bondurant has delayed establishing this utility and the monthly fee until now because of the sanitary sewer rate increases the City has been experiencing for the last several years. Unfortunately, this has resulted in a deficit of approximately \$150,000 in the City's stormwater fund. The City cannot delay establishing the Utility any longer. It will likely take several years to eliminate the existing deficit.

It's summer in Bondurant and many of us are looking forward to relaxing in the backyard, cooking on the grill and enjoying a vacation with family. The City is taking advantage of the nice weather to get started on our list of projects.

One of these is the completion of the trail that was started last year. I'm excited about the opportunity that the second trail will offer the community. Once completed, pedestrian and bicycle traffic along 2nd Street will be much safer, but that's not the only reason I'm excited. The creation of this trail is the first step in connecting Bondurant with the vast network of trails throughout central Iowa. The city is currently working with the Farmers CO-OP to define a route that will allow us to connect the 2nd Street bike path from Lake Petoka to the Chichaqua Valley Trail trailhead on the eastern edge of the city. Also, we're already in the planning stages of the other part of the project that will connect the 2nd Street trail to the planned trail on the northern edge of Altoona. We are working closely with communities like Altoona and Pleasant Hill to ensure that our trail systems join together at the borders.

Below is a list of some of our current projects and a brief update. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact City Hall at (515) 967-2418 and we'll do our best to answer your questions.

Projects Update

- **Completion of Main St. Reconstruction** – With installation of landscaping, benches and trash bins, the Main Street project is complete. It was completed in time for this year's Summerfest, allowing everyone to enjoy the new look and feel of the area.
- **2nd St. Bike Path** – The contractor has been picked and work will begin shortly. The first piece we expect to construct is a section of trail that connects 5th St NE to the edge of the new high school property. While not initially part of the project, we felt that this needs to be completed before the new high school opens for students in the fall. The piece from Casey's on 2nd Street to Lake Petoka is scheduled to be completed by fall.
- **Paine Heights Storm Sewer** – The first part of the plan involved home inspections of connections to the sanitary sewer system. Many of those inspections have been completed and only a few homes remain. The next phase involves pumping a non-toxic smoke into the sanitary sewer

system to look for leaks and cracks in pipes and other connections to the sewer system.

- **Expand Parks & Recreation Programming** – The City is currently looking at the land just north of 2nd street between Mallard Pointe and Mallard Creek subdivisions for future park use. If you're interested, the next Parks and Recreation meeting is scheduled for July 15 at 6:00 p.m., at the City Hall.
- **City Website** – The design phase is complete and staff will be trained on the new system shortly.
- **Bike Path connection to Chichaqua Valley Trail and Altoona** – On June 7, the City Council contracted Stanley Consultants to do a study to determine the best location for a Multi-Use Trail along the WRA Sewer Alignment. This is the first step in constructing a southern portion of the trail.
