SUMMARY EXPLANATION: The City of Bondurant is required to hold a public hearing on the CDBG grant. The public hearing has been advertised as required by law. At the public hearing, the following information will be shared with those present:

Need for the CDBG project	COVID-19 has interrupted the school year. In order to access additional learning opportunities, families need access to technology. The City and the school district coordinated to assess technology and internet gaps to determine how to mitigate the impact across the community. The City currently offers for check out a total of 36 hotspots. In order to fill the identified gaps to support the needs of families without internet, the City would need to add hotspots for checkout.
Description of CDBG Funded Project and Activities	Provide additional hotspots to be checked out of the library and provide families access to the internet. Additionally, provide tablets for families to check out. Hotspots: fee of \$20 per month and requires a minimum 12-month contract and would be a total of \$10,800. Tablets: Six Samsung Galaxy Tablets (\$1,800) for the Library to have available for people who are quarantined due to COVID-19 to be able to check out.
